

NO MORE STIGMA

"Tim" and "Millie" were born with albinism, a genetic condition that results in the absence of melanin, a pigment that gives color to the skin, hair, and eyes. In Angola, as in other African countries, the condition often leads to stigmatization. The children's father could not accept their condition, so he abandoned their mother, who later died of alcoholism. The orphaned children, along with their sister "Maggie," were cast aside, living separately and in great need. When they showed up at Project SER, run by ACTION fieldworkers Paulo and Dayse Varao, the leaders could not turn a blind eye to the difficult circumstances of their lives.

Through much prayer and seeking help, Paulo and Dayse were able to place the three children into a healthy home – together – something the children only dreamed could happen. Maggie, Tim, and Millie study, receive food and biblical discipleship at the Project, and are accompanied to monthly medical appointments due to their poor health and skin condition.

Every day, the leaders of Project SER receive hundreds of children who are malnourished. Some of them are left by their parents all day long without food, some are found wandering the streets alone. Other children are orphans, relying on the help of extended family members who may not want to care for them. For many children, the food they receive at Project SER is the only meal they will eat that day. Project SER plays a vital role in helping them develop holistically.





Paulo and Dayse praise God for being able to be the hand of the Lord, blessing and helping these children towards a better future. They embody the words of James 1:27: "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress..." Will you help them?
