
Near the end of Mary Ann's nine-month term

Recording a Podcast with Adam Hussey beyond comparing our personal relationship with our "Abba! Father!" than with the passing fame our deceived and darkening world offers us (Romans 8:15-17; Galatians 4:6-7). With our convictions in view, by God's abundant grace, we are walking in-step with the Spirit carrying the shining life-giving light of the Gospel to the nations. Here is our point: We want what God wants for us, not what we want for ourselves.

Mentoring

In recent months we have had several significant conversations and prayer with young people wanting to step into ministry. We have also talked with older people who want a meaningful retirement because they are sensing the Spirit stirring them to move into global ministry. Additionally we've had lengthy conversations with church leaders about their desire to expand their church's ministry to people from other nations living in their cities and to strengthen their global outreach by sending well-equipped long-term workers from their congregations to the nations. We listened to their stories, heard their passions and prayed to the Lord of the harvest with them asking that He will show them their role in helping complete the Great Commission. It is clear to these leaders that they need to go with the Gospel themselves, or send others to do that, or be involved with both going and sending. It is also clear to them that disobeying Christ's Commission is not an option.

Preparing long-term global workers

In a recent article titled, "Why Missions Training Matters in 2025" (on the Global Frontier Missions website) the following statement is made under the subtitle, "Long-Term Impact Requires Preparation."

Missions isn't just about going—it's about staying, serving, and multiplying. Burnout, culture shock, and relational breakdowns are real threats to long-term effectiveness. Missions training covers vital areas like cross-cultural communication, team dynamics, conflict resolution, and emotional health. Those who are well-prepared are more likely to stay the course and bear lasting fruit. In 2025, where missionary attrition is still a significant issue, preparation remains the key to long-term success.

We strongly agree with this statement. This is why Mary Ann and I are committed to doing all we can to train global workers serving in the Great Commission. It is our deep desire to strengthen the relationship between our workers, their sending churches and ACTION. We view ACTION as a steward of the workers that their churches send to serve with us in Christ's harvest. One way we are helping with training is by Podcasts.

In July Adam Hussey, our longtime friend, former coworker in Manila and a skilled videographer, interviewed Mary Ann and me for three Podcast conversations. Our topics were *Spiritual*

Resiliency, Detecting and Preventing Burnout and Effective Pre-field Training for Long-term Global *Workers.* They will be part of a 12-episode Podcast series for appointed ACTION workers before they leave for their place of service. Pray for Adam as he edits the 12 interviews. Pray for their effectiveness in helping appointees as they prepare to leave, for their churches to send them well and for ACTION in this vital long-term partnership. Theological foundations are more crucial now than ever. Spiritual warfare is intensifying. Long-term fruitfulness in cross-cultural ministry requires training. We need workers who are not only willing to go, but who are trained and ready to go. Our world is globalizing fast and is very complex.

Another way we are helping prepare workers for long-term service is through the ACTION Skills Conference. It is our desire to see all ACTION members involved in skills development throughout their years of service, whether they are just starting or have been with us for 50 years (this year is ACTION's 50th anniversary). Those who attend an ASC can rub shoulders with other ACTION people so we learn from each other, worship together and pray for one another and our respective fields. People who have attended an ASC tell us how beneficial they are and ask when the next one will be. Last summer our Skills Conference was in Wisconsin. Next January, our fourth, will be in Mission, Texas. The theme is "Get Ready, Stay Ready." Pray for us as we decide on the topics, find speakers, develop the program, and look for children's workers.

Health

Recently I was diagnosed with Atrial Fibrillation and Cardiomyopathy. The diagnosis started with a routine colonoscopy in June. The Anesthesiologist had difficulty regulating my heartbeat during the procedure and during my recovery. Later I had several tests and wore a heart monitor. They confirmed the diagnosis. I will see a Cardiologist on September 4 in order to learn how to manage my new normal. I am fine other than at times I feel slight palpitations and a little dizzy. Now that I know my diagnosis I realize I have felt these symptoms for a few months. I'm grateful this was caught early. I'm also grateful for good



medical care. I am taking a blood thinner to prevent clotting and a stroke. Please pray for my consultation with the Cardiologist.

Going to South Asia

For months we've been involved with planning and praying for our trip to a South Asian country in September with a team from the Groton Bible Chapel in Groton, Connecticut. When Mary Ann and I learned of my diagnosis in late July we asked our Primary Care Doctor if we should go or not. We decided we would not go unless I had medical clearance. My Doctor consulted with the Cardiologist I'll see and he gave me the go ahead. We are happy we can join GBC. This will be our fourth time to minister there and GBC's first. We are scheduled to leave September 9. Because we waited for medical clearance we are working diligently on the messages we'll give during a missions conference
