

MY SPIRITUAL HISTORY:

I have a strong background in the Evangelical community. I experienced my new birth in July 1975, and I have ever since not had any cause to regret following the Lord. My Christian growth process was very timely, following ¾ of a decade in my Christian nurturing, I began to show interest in Ministerial work by taking leadership training and attending conferences. My first ordination occurred in 1989 under the United Christian Church and Ministerial Association based in Cleveland TN USA while I was in West Africa.

As an accredited Minister under the Assemblies of God General Council, my Christian faith cuts across denominational barrier. I have travelled extensively, and I have special interest in Christian Education and leadership. While I was in Italy, I received a scholarship to study theology under the Baptist Union of Italy, and the board anticipated having me work among the immigrant workers. I later relocated to Canada, where I completed my Master of Arts' degree program in Christian studies under the Associated Canadian Theological Schools (ACTS). I further obtained a doctoral degree in educational leadership (Ed.D) from the University of Phoenix (UOP). I've had a rough marital life, but God blessed me with four adult children and five grandchildren currently settled in Canada.

WHAT GOD HAS SAID:

When I gave my life to Christ on that faithful day in July 1975, my total surrender came when I heard the audible voice "GET OUT" along with a wave that slightly moved me a bit. The dramatic experience was the fullness of joy I felt within me, I felt different, I started praising God without restriction or caution whether anyone else was around. I inquired after I opened my eyes if the person standing next to me heard the same voice I heard, the answer was "no." Within me I have had contemplations:

(1) could it be that the voice was telling the evil spirit that could have possibly been in me, to "Get out" and I was liberated?

(2) Could it be that although it was an attractive church, yet not the right church for me, as such, the force controlling that gathering was asking me to get out?

Or 3) Could it be that the divine presence of God was confirming my son-ship adoption and asking me to get out of deception that might have been in that church?

For over 45 Years now in 2020, none has ever explained to me what that voice meant. Apart from that dramatic experience and some dreams over the years during which I saw some came to pass, I have ultimately relied on what the word of God says.

SPIRITUAL PLAN:

My desire is to finish well in communicating what God has deposited in me, either in Church or classroom setting. I volunteer as a visiting Chaplain to King County Correctional Facility (KCCF), and participate in Jail Ministry under the auspices of Prisoners For Christ (PFC), I also engage in Pastoral & Christian Leadership Development (PCLD) Training and offer Pastoral counseling to new Church Plants and individuals across borders. My passion is to cultivate long-term relationships with people, which is very vital in Christian discipleship. As a heterogeneous community supporter, I've had first-hand experience living, working and assimilating into the cultures of other countries. I believe this experience has provided me with a unique appreciation for cultural diversity with the sensitivity and understanding needed to value the differences in a multi-cultural Church community. I am trusting in God to help me contribute toward achieving the objectives He had outlined in my earthly journey.
