Multiplying Disciple-Making **Disciples**

Making disciples and strengthening local churches are two core values of ACTION. After years of teaching and training, the ACTION Uganda (AU) staff are transitioning into the top leadership positions. Under the accountability of AU's Board of Directors, Pastor Oketta Peter, Country Director-designate, is responsible for three ministry leaders and 27 staff - all of whom are Ugandan nationals. This team has three focus areas: the Jesus Is the Truth School (JITT); the Family Strengthening Outreach Team, who serve former Home of Love children; and the Pastoral Leadership Development Team. AU invites missionaries to come alongside them as partners and mentors in these ministries.

Juma's Story

Juma, 13, began the school year as a new student at ITT, eager to learn and making friends. It wasn't until weeks later that school staff realized he had been lying about being registered at the school. In fact, his parents had enrolled him in a less expensive public school nearby, but Juma yearned to attend JITT. After much prayer, the teachers and staff explained to Juma that he

could no longer attend JITT and helped him transition into his new school. But God used even Juma's deceit for His glory. While at JITT, Juma, who is from a Muslim background, believed in Christ. Juma had to move back to South Sudan and is living with his mother. She would like to send Juma back to JITT, if a sponsor can be found for him. He is one of many students waiting for financial assistance to attend the school and receive an education from a biblical worldview.
